The Bible is full of stories of God's healing presence in peoples' lives. When Jesus traveled and preached the gospel, it was often in association with healing of the body, mind and the spirit. In Luke 4:40 we read "At sunset, the people brought to Jesus all who had various kinds of sickness, and laying his hands on each one, he healed them."

Later in the New Testament, James calls us to pray for those who are sick. He writes "Is any sick among you? let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord: and the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he has committed sins, they shall be forgiven him."

In light of the above and other Scriptures, the Well Church has decided to offer a Service of Prayer and Healing. This Service will be in addition to the Sunday morning worship. It will be a liturgy of prayer, music, exhortation, and Communion to experience the healing power of God in our congregation and beyond.

If you or anyone you know would like to participate, or if you just want to pray for others who are suffering, you will be gladly welcome. There will be ministers available for prayer and anointing if desired.

We plan to have this service monthly on a Sunday evening beginning in May.
